4. Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP)
The purpose of the Personal Responsibility Education Program, created through the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 2010 (Pub.L. 111-148), is to provide grants to provide youth with comprehensive sex education and life skills that will enable them to make responsible decisions to lead safe and healthy lives. PPACA amended Title V of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 701 *et seq.*) by adding section 513, Personal Responsibility Education Program. A portion of these funds (called PREP) have been designated to implement, test, and evaluate innovative programs through a competitive grant process. North Carolina has applied for funds to expand 7 existing Adolescent Parenting Program (APP) projects and add 8 new APP projects. An evaluation of these APP projects is also planned utilizing 15 non APP comparison sites. These federal funds are being administered by the Administration for Children and Families' (ACF) Family and Youth Services Bureau (FYSB).

5. Support for Pregnant and Parenting Teens – DHHS Office of Adolescent Health
The Office of Adolescent Health (OAH) within the Office of Public Health and Science, is accepting applications for competitive grants for the development and implementation of programs to assist pregnant and parenting teens and women, as authorized by Sections 10211- 10214 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111-148). The Act appropriates \$25 million for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2019 and authorizes the Secretary of HHS, in collaboration and coordination with the Secretary of Education (as appropriate) to establish and administer a Pregnancy Assistance Fund for the purpose of awarding competitive grants to States to assist pregnant and parenting teens and women. It is anticipated that up to 25 grants in the amounts of \$500,000 -

\$2,000,000 per year will be awarded. Grants will not exceed three years (and funding for years 2-3 is subject to the availability of funds).

7. State Personal Responsibility Education Program (STATE PREP)

The purpose of the Personal Responsibility Education Program , created through the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 2010 (Pub.L. 111-148), is to provide grants to provide youth with comprehensive sex education and life skills that will enable them to make responsible decisions to lead safe and healthy lives. PPAC amended Title V of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 701 *et seq.*) by adding section 513, Personal Responsibility Education Program. The majority of these funds are being distributed to states on a formula basis to implement evidenced based programs that reduce teen pregnancies and enhance life skills.
