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

- Asthma w/beta agonist overuse, consider controller med
- Female aged 21-65, no record of TAH, no pap in 3 yrs
- Diabetic, no A1c claim in 1 yr.
- Diabetic, no eye exam claim in 1 yr
- CAD with prior MI, consider beta blocker



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Visit History shows

- Inpatient stay & ED visits- primary and secondary diagnoses, facility
- Imaging – primary diagnosis, facility (How many CT scans?, Where was the last CXR?)
- Office Visits- Who else does the patient see? How many visits total so far?
- Lab values- only from LabCorp, but can see: What was the Creatinine before?
Past A1c, Hb or TSH? Rheum/ID workups?

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


