






# Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia

- 50 members of Task Force and Steering Committee




# Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia

- Report officially published 4/2016.
- 33 Recommendations addressed across 16 areas as required by legislation. Organized under the framework of Dementia Capable North Carolina.
- Legislative action on 4 items in short session, including increased funding for CAP DA, Project Care, and 211/ no wrong door. Also passage of uniform guardianship.
- Much work being done in communities.
- 14 of the recommendations are all ready implemented or under way!




# Mental Health and Substance Abuse

- Partners and Funders: DMHDDSAS and Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust.
- Co-chairs: Senator Angela Bryant, Representative Josh Dobson, Dr. Courtney Cantrell, Dr. John Santopietro.
- 59 members of Task Force (3 working groups) and steering committee.
- Focus on 1) Older Adults, 2) Adolescents, 3) cross cutting systems issues.



# Mental Health and Substance Use

- Report to be published next week! Co-hosting the biennial meeting of the North Carolina Mental Health, Substance Use, and Aging co as part of release strategy.
- Recommendations to address system funding, community resources, quality, integrated care, and leadership at the state level.




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# All Payer Claims Database


- Partnership with NCDHHS, Institute for Emerging Issues, and funded by The Duke Endowment.
- Co-chaired by Joe Cooper and Blanton Godfrey.
- 48 members of the Task Force and Steering Committee.
- Considering increased access to data on cost of care and quality with a goal of increased transparency, quality, patient experience, and a decrease in variation of care and cost.

# Bridging Local Systems




- Partnership with DHHS, NC Council on Community Programs, and NC Association of County Departments of Social Services. Funded by The Duke Endowment.
- Regional leadership summits to enhance communication and collaboration between LME/MCOs and county DSS agencies around the care and services for populations seen by both systems.
- Statewide Leadership Steering Committee to review feedback and recommendations from Regional Collaboratives.





# Health Care Analytics


- Newest project! Contract awarded by NC DHHS on October 1.


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# 2016 Annual Meeting

  - Social determinants, poverty, and community development (Alzheimer's and Dementia, Food Policy among others)




